Northwestern Health Sciences University, previously Northwestern College of Chiropractic, has been an international leader in natural health care education, patient care, and research for more than 65 years. Here are some reasons why:

- Northwestern integrates a variety of natural health care professions into one incredible educational opportunity. Programs available include:
 - Northwestern College of Chiropractic
 - Minnesota College of Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine
 - Northwestern's School of Massage Therapy
- Northwestern boasts 300,000 square feet of state-of-the-art laboratories, classrooms, clinics and top-notch facilities, located on 25 beautifully-landscaped acres in suburban Minneapolis, Minnesota.
- Northwestern has a limited enrollment of less than 1,000 students and a student-to-teacher ratio of 11-1, allowing for a more personal and close-knit atmosphere among its faculty and international student body.
- Our classes are taught by world-renowned instructors in small class sizes, which allow students easy access to outstanding educational resources.
- Northwestern has pioneered an extraordinary clinic system, with a University public clinic system, more than 150 internship sites in private practice clinics, a range of clinical partnerships with social service agencies, and final term preceptorship opportunities around the world. The University's public clinic system records more than 72,000 patient visits a year, making it the largest provider of natural health care services in Minnesota.
- The Woodwinds Natural Care Center on the Woodwinds Health Campus, which features a healthy collaboration between conventional medicine and natural health care, is just one of our many pioneering clinical education programs.
- At Northwestern, you will be surrounded with students from other natural care professions that you will associate with throughout your career.
- The University's student population collectively receives more than \$21 million in financial assistance through federal, state, institutional, and private programs.
- The Career Services office assists students in finding jobs after graduation through a variety of effective strategies.
- The University has an international reputation in scientific research, with nearly \$10 million in federally funded research since 1999.





QUICK FACTS ABOUT NORTHWESTERN COLLEGE OF CHIROPRACTIC

- The curriculum consists of 10 trimesters (3 1/3 years) and more than 4,300 contact hours in a full day-time program.
- Our basic sciences, clinical, chiropractic, and business education is exceptional in preparing students to pass the National Boards and successfully enter clinical practice. More than 90 percent of Northwestern's graduates pass the National Boards on their first attempt.
- The chiropractic program puts learning into practice through a practicum experience that includes five full trimesters in a clinical setting. The University's interdisciplinary programs offer students the chance to observe and discuss patient care with other health care professionals within a multidisciplinary setting.
- Classes are taught by a world-renowned faculty in an 11-to-1 student-to-teacher ratio.
- Northwestern's limited enrollment allows students easy access to extraordinary faculty of PhD's, DC's, and MD's.
- Methods classes include hands-on training in manipulation every trimester.
- With a University public clinic system, more than 150 internship sites in private practice clinics, a range of clinical partnerships with community-based social service agencies, and final term preceptorship opportunities around the world, Northwestern chiropractic students total two to three times the required number of patient visits by the time they graduate.
- Northwestern's practice management courses begin in the first trimester and provide students with the business skills necessary to succeed in clinical practice.
- You can complete your undergraduate science requirements and your Bachelor of Science Degree in Human Biology at Northwestern.
- More than 90 percent of Northwestern College of Chiropractic alumni are working professionals in the United States, Canada, Mexico, and other countries around the world.
