

T7 Clinic Sign-up Options

Bloomington Natural Care Center

This clinic has been seeing patients and conducting chiropractic research since 1985. Presently, there are several chiropractic and acupuncture clinicians seeing patients at this facility.

Currently, the clinic sees approximately 1,600 patient visits a month. Functioning as a primary contact clinic, patients present with a variety of complaints and conditions that are neuromusculoskeletal as well as visceral. Patients also vary in age from newborn to geriatric. The clinic personnel include clinicians who collectively have many years of practice experience, and a staff that is well qualified and strives for patient satisfaction.

Placement: interns choosing BNCC during Prep Lab 4 clinic sign-up will be assigned to a specific faculty clinician during orientation at BNCC.

Woodwinds Natural Care Center

The Woodwinds clinic offers an excellent opportunity to develop and expand the skills necessary to practice as a Doctor of Chiropractic. Services offered to patients at this clinic include chiropractic care, massage therapy, acupuncture, homeopathy, and consultations for nutrition and herbs. This provides interns with first hand knowledge of seeing a totally integrated natural health care system at work. This busy clinic provides interns with ample opportunity to improve skills in doctor-patient communication, adjusting, use of physiotherapy, diagnosis, as well as learning exercise rehabilitation, business management and insurance protocols.

Placement: interns choosing Woodwinds during Prep Lab 4 clinic sign-up will be assigned to a specific faculty clinician during orientation at Woodwinds

Community Based Internship (CBI) Program

NWCC initiated the CBI Program in 1993 in its continuing effort to enhance the education and preparedness of its students entering the field of chiropractic. The program is designed to give students the opportunity to continue moving towards their clinical learning objectives by working closely with select experienced field doctors. A CBI provides T8, T9, and T10 interns with a clinical experience in an independent field doctor's practice. This program is an enhanced mentorship-style learning model in which a student works closely with the DC assisting with, and being instructed in, all aspects of patient care and successful practice management. The successful CBI intern is a motivated, self-directed, and open-minded student who can work closely with the CBI administration and assigned mentor to develop an individualized clinical learning experience.

Placement: interns sign-up for CBI during Prep Lab 4. Then schedule an interview with the Department of Clinical Education who will place each intern with the most appropriate CBI mentor.
