T8 Clinic Orientation

Part I Orientation

- during finals (date, time, and room TBA per the Summer 2007 finals schedule)
- the Intern's Clinic Handbook written exam is part of this class. Interns must pass this exam to be eligible to enter Clinical Internship III.

Part II Orientation

- during the first Fall 2007 Case Studies I class (date, time, and room TBA per the Fall 2007 class schedule)

Part III Orientation

- during the week of September 4, 2007 as you schedule it with your T8 clinic supervisor

Clinical Education uses e-mail as a primary form of communication with interns. Updates regarding these classes and Clinical Internships III-IV-V-VI are e-mailed to interns. It is expected that interns keep current with their Northwestern e-mail.

Looking forward to the 10th trimester:

T10 Externship (i.e. Preceptorship) is a specialized program available to students through Clinical Education. Students are eligible for an Externship during their 10th trimester if they have completed all clinical requirements.

Students can leave a University or CBI clinic for a 10th trimester externship experience when the following criteria have been met:

- 1) the Externship doctor and placement has been approved by Clinical Education;
- 2) all internship requirements (i.e. quantitative, workbook assignments, and rotations) have been verified by the Clinical Education Coordinator as complete;
- 3) the face-to-face T9 check-out has been completed with the Clinical Education Coordinator;
- 4) the 9th trimester has ended and the 10th trimester has started;
- 5) Clinical Education has authorized the student to start the externship.

Students with a signed contract with an authorized doctor are covered by malpractice insurance and qualify for earning credit toward completing requirements for graduation. Students who have not turned in a signed contract and/or are doing clinical activities without being authorized by Clinical Education will not receive credit toward completing requirements for graduation.
