EBSCO Databases (Academic Research Premier). The world's largest academic multi-disciplinary database, *Academic Search Premier* provides full text for nearly 4,700 publications, including full text for more than 3,600 peer-reviewed journals. PDF backfiles to 1975 or further are available for well over one hundred journals, and searchable cited references are provided for more than 1,000 titles. This database is updated on a daily basis via EBSCO*host*.

THE COCHRANE LIBRARY. This collection of seven evidence-based databases enables all those involved with health care decisions to keep up to date with the latest evidence in their field of interest.

AltHealthWatch. The Greenawalt Library provides access to this alternative health database which provides full text for more than 140 publications, including full text for many peer-reviewed journals. *Alt HealthWatch* provides in-depth coverage across the full spectrum of subject areas covered by complementary and alternative medicine dating back to 1990.

PubMed. PubMed provides access to bibliographic information that includes MEDLINE and OLDMEDLINE, as well as:

- The out-of-scope citations from certain MEDLINE journals, primarily general science and chemistry journals, for which the life sciences articles are indexed for MEDLINE;
- Citations that precede the date that a journal was selected for MEDLINE indexing;
- Some additional life science journals that submit full text to PubMedCentral and receive a qualitative review by NLM.

Half of the journals to which we currently subscribe are indexed in Medline. It focuses on the literature of the Western medical profession. It also indexes a few chiropractic journals and many acupuncture, massage, and alternative health journals. Search for full text by entering *topic* AND free full text[*sb*].

NetLibrary. NetLibrary eBooks are digital full-text versions of books such as reference works, scholarly monographs, literature and fiction, and 3,407 publicly-accessible titles.
