

**Anoka Ramsey Community College
Suggested Pre-Chiropractic Curriculum**

90 semester credits at bachelor's degree level:

A minimum of 90 semester credits (135 quarter credits) at the bachelor's degree level at a college or university accredited by a regional accrediting agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education or an equivalent foreign institution.*

24 semester credits in the Life and Physical Sciences:

A minimum of 24 semester credits (36 quarter credits) in the Life and Physical Sciences. Of these 24 semester credits (36 quarter credits), at least half must include a lecture and lab component.

Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 on the best of the 90 semester credits:

A minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale on the best of the 90 semester credits (135 quarter credits) completed. The best 90 credits must include the 24 semester credits (36 quarter credits) of Life and Physical Sciences.

- **Biology I (with lab)** – BIOL 1106 Principles of Biology I (4 credits)

- **General Chemistry II (with lab)** – CHEM 1062 Principles of Chemistry II (4 credits)
- **Organic Chemistry I (with lab)** – CHEM 2061 Organic Chemistry I (5 credits)
- **Biology (with lab)** – BIOL 1107 Principles of Biology II (4 credits)
- **Biology (with lab)** – BIOL 2113 Human Anatomy & Physiology I (4 credits)
- **Biology (with lab)** – BIOL 2114 Human Anatomy & Physiology II (4 credits)
- **Physics I (with lab)** – PHYS 1317 General Physics I (5 credits)
- **Health/PhyEd/Rec** – HPER 1112 Nutrition (3 credits)
- **Health/PhyEd/Rec** – HPER 1200 Anatomy of Movement (2 credits)
- **Health/PhyEd/Rec** – HPER 2206 Exercise Physiology (4 credits)
- **Medical Terminology** – BIOL 1102 Medical Terminology (2 credits)
