As of April 3, 2025, NWHSU enrolled 1089 students. The majority of students are enrolled full-time; 64% are female; roughly 46% of students report being white and 23% do not report their race and/or ethnicity and are thus “unknown”. Approximately 22% of undergraduate students received Pell grants.

Federal Financial Aid Penalties for Drug Law Violations

NWHSU is committed to creating a safe and welcoming environment for students, employees, patients, and guests. [The drug and alcohol use policy](#) describes acceptable uses and penalties when the policy is violated.

In addition to campus sanctions and criminal penalties, a student who has been convicted of a [drug-related violation](#) under federal or state law can be disqualified for federal financial aid funding.

Those convicted of possessing illegal drugs will lose financial aid eligibility for:

- First offense – one year from date of conviction
- Second offense – two years from date of conviction
- Third+ offense(s) – indefinitely

Those convicted of selling illegal drugs will lose financial aid eligibility for:

- First offense – two years from date of conviction
- Second offense – indefinitely

Retention Rates

Retention rate is the proportion of degree-seeking students in a cohort who remain registered for courses past the 10th day of their fourth term occurring in the 2024-2025 academic year. The university's retention rate is 91.98%.

Graduation Rates

Graduation rate is the proportion of degree- or certificate-seeking students who completed their degree within 150% of normal time during the 2024-2025 academic year. The university's graduation rate is 72.8%.
